General Information

Venue

The conference is being held at the Astir Palace Hotel in Vouliagmeni, a beach resort which is 25 to 30 minutes from Athens and 15 minutes from the airport. The area is a very picturesque one and an attractive and beautiful location in Greece for the meeting.

Social Programme

On the first day of the conference is a city tour which will include a visit to key attractions in Athens. Climb the processional path to the summit of the Acropolis and appreciate at close quarters the exquisite lines of the Parthenon.

A full social programme will be arranged for accompanying persons. This will include visits to attractions - ancient, Byzantine and modern - in and around Athens.

Two pre-conference tours are on offer depending on the demand. To appreciate the ancient Greek world there can be no better site to visit than Delphi which is the location of the first tour. The second tour is an idyllic Aegean Island Cruise which is highly recommended.

A post-conference excursion is also being planned to Cos, the island of Hippocrates.

Further information about the pre- and post-conference tours will be sent on registration.

Hotel Accommodation

A range of accommodation is available in the Vouliagmeni Region. The categories and costs are summarised on the registration form. De luxe accommodation is available in the Astir Palace Hotel where the Conference is being held. Once this is full de luxe accommodation will be reserved in other nearby hotels. Accommodation in the different categories may be limited and early reservation is advisable.

Request for accommodation should be received before 10 July. Bookings will be confirmed upon receipt of a deposit equal to **two** overnights. Cancellation will not be possible after 10 July. For cancellations before that date the deposit will be returned less 10% cancellation fee.

About the Meeting

For Whom is the Meeting Intended?

The conference will be of relevance to all teachers, educators and administrators in the health care professions. It will look at the changes taking place in undergraduate or basic training, postgraduate or specialist training, and continuing education.

The topics covered during the meeting will be wide ranging. Five themes have been identified for particular consideration. These themes arise out of the discussions and recommendations of the World Summit on Medical Education in Edinburgh in August 1993. All participants will receive a copy of the proceedings of the World Conference.

Themes for the Meeting

Theme 1: Making Education More Relevant

The importance of making medical education relevant to the needs of the community is recognised. How this can be achieved through the development of a core curriculum in undergraduate and postgraduate education which covers the key learning objectives, educational strategiessuch as problembased learning and community-orientated medical education, and other approaches?

Theme 2: Making Education More Effective

A re-appraisal of approaches to teaching and learning with greater attention being paid to student-centred learning, active rather than passive learning, and the appropriate use of the new technologies can help to make learning more efficient and more effective.

Theme 3: Trends in Assessment

Assessment has an important influence on student learning. Developments in this area include performance based

assessment using tools such as the Objective Structured Clinical Examination and a new emphasis on the assessment of attitudes and higher level competencies such as thinking skills.

Theme 4: The Continuum of Education

Postgraduate and continuing education are as important as the undergraduate programme. There should be a seamless transition between each of the three phases. Issues such as certification and recertification, monitoring and international standards need to be appraised.

Theme 5: The Change Process

Bringing about change in medical education is notoriously difficult. Change does not happen by chance and must be carefully planned. Much is already known about the change process and approaches which can help to overcome the obstacles and barriers and facilitate progress

Format for the Meeting

The meeting will include

- plenary sessions during which invited speakers will address key issues relating to the themes of the conference, followed by a discussion of the topic
- "free paper' sessions. Each presenter will be allocated 10 minutes plus five minutes discussion time. You are invited to submit abstracts for consideration.
- workshops or master-class sessions where an expert in a field of medical education reviews the topic. The workshops will convey new ideas, skills and techniques and feature handson, interactive and instructional activities.
- a poster exhibition of participants' work and the work of AMEE corporate, institutional and individual members.

The meeting will provide an opportunity for you to

- take part in discussions and contribute to conclusions and recommendations with regard to some of the key topics and issues facing medical education today
- hear about exciting new developments and present your own work and thoughts for consideration by the conference participants
- meet and talk with colleagues from a wide field of backgrounds interested in medical education.
