What will this webinar be about?

The webinar initiates a discussion on where the personal development of the health professionals workforce is heading. Are we supporting and fostering the right characteristics? Are we selecting the right students? How are we supporting personal growth? What role does socialisation play in professional identity formation? Is the 'Hidden curriculum' all obscure, or can we unearth, visualize and teach some of it? Target audience are faculty who are responsible for curriculum development, and/or the admission process.



Prof. David Taylor (Gulf Medical University, Ajman, United Arab Emirates) is a Professor of Medical Education & Physiology and the Director of the Center for Leadership and Innovation in Health Professions Education at Gulf Medical University and Professor of Medical Education at Sun Yat-sen University, Guangzhou, China. His work focuses on leadership, accreditation, and capacity building in health professions education. He contributes to regional and global initiatives that foster mission-driven, socially accountable institutions.



Prof. Athanasia Printza (School of Medicine, at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki) is Professor of Otorhinolaryngology-Phoniatics, member of The European Academy of Sciences and Arts, member of the Panel of Experts of "The DO'L Medical Educator Award", Oxford Centre of Medical Education, Fulbright Scholar, President of the Hellenic Society of Phoniatics and Swallowing disorders and Deputy President of the School of Medicine, AUTH, Committee of International Relations.



Kristina Pavloski (Medical Education Liaison Officer for EMSA) is a 6th-year medical student at the Medical Faculty of Ss. Cyril and Methodius University in Skopje.
